

Apostasy, False Unity And The Ecumenical Movement

Biblical unity is based on God's truth. It is impossible for Christians to have unity with any person teaching a false plan of salvation. How any non-Catholic could get so easily duped by Catholics saying, Praise the Lord, Hallelujah, Amen, claiming to believe salvation is by grace, etc., to conclude they have changed since Vatican Council II is amazing. The changes were only surface changes and not doctrinal. Note: Vatican Council II reaffirmed the Council of Trent, where over 100 anathemas were issued to non-Catholics!

"This sacred council [Vatican Council II] accepts loyally the venerable faith of our ancestors in the living communion which exists between us and our brothers who are in the glory of heaven or who are yet being purified after their death; and it **proposes again the decrees of the Second Council of Nicea, of the Council of Florence, and of the Council of Trent.**" (Vatican Council II, Costello Publishing Co., 1984, Vol. 1, p. 412, bold emphasis mine)

Charismatic Catholicism has misled many, especially in "full gospel" circles. The main root of deception comes with Catholics "speaking in tongues." Though apparently not widely known, at least some charismatic Catholic churches talk in "tongues" and **prophecy in the name of "Mary"**! It is impossible for genuine tongues to be found among any group like that or which has a false plan of salvation—one that is different from the Holy Bible. For people to sacrifice Biblical truth for surface unity is not spiritually wholesome, loving or healthy for souls.
