

You Have Been "ENTRUSTED With The Gospel." What Are You Doing About It?

All Christians have been given a very serious call and valuable trust—to spread the gospel. Again, all Christians with NO exception have been given this same awesome responsibility of spreading the gospel (the Biblical plan of salvation), but few seem to be doing anything about it, to the detriment of other precious souls, as well as their own. It is a very serious act of irresponsibility not to be faithful with this trust and for which we must give account. In fact, the seriousness of this sin of omission and neglect will cost a Christian his potential entrance into the Kingdom of God (Mt 25:24-30).

Regardless who you are as a Christian you can fulfill your responsibility as a minister of reconciliation, in part, by distributing doctrinally sound salvation literature. Salvation tracts have MANY ADVANTAGES over a verbal witness, though we must never downplay the verbal message of the Gospel. Please consider that salvation literature: never forgets to make the intended points about the Gospel; never is too busy to do its job; never gets sick or injured; never compromises with the truth; never argues but will always boldly and unashamedly witness to every person, regardless who they are; can be reread by thousands of people over many years in many different places; speaks out its message when it is most convenient and opportune to the recipient of the tract and can be easily verified, if accurate Scripture references are cited in it. Salvation literature penetrates homes, prisons, hospitals, offices and foreign countries. Though you can't speak a foreign language, you can distribute salvation literature in that language and still be effectively understood for the Gospel's sake. Tracts can be passed on to one person after another and continue to bring forth salvations.

So then, men ought to regard us as servants of Christ and as those ENTRUSTED with the secret things of God. (1 Cor 4:1)

On the contrary, they saw that I had been ENTRUSTED with the task of PREACHING THE GOSPEL to the Gentiles, just as Peter had been to the Jews. (Gal 2:7)

On the contrary, we speak as men approved by God to be ENTRUSTED WITH THE GOSPEL. We are not trying to please men but God, who tests our hearts. (1 Thess 2:4)

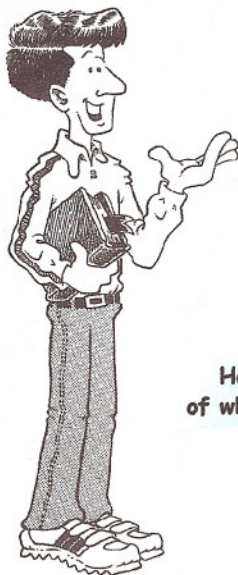
He said to them, Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation (Mk. 16:15).
